Please take note that as I compose this report, to day I have received (3) – three of (6) – Detachment Quarterly reports, Those being PVC Bruce Cater – 052, Tamarac – 755 and Intracoastal Detachment – 1058. These reports have been attached to this communication for your review.

The following Detachments have failed to comply; Gen. A.A. Vandergrift – 068, Broward Law Enforcement – 549, and Marathon Devil Dogs – 1216.

My activity and Detachment visits have been very lean for this past quarter and it is my intention to focus on my better attendance to the detachments right after the Convention. Please note that my main focus for the past quarter has been primarily on Intracoastal Detachment 1058 as it relates to completing the membership audit for the detachment. Please note that to date we now have over 50 members that have paid their dues up for the 2017 / 2018 dues period. Further, we continue to see other members stagger in and pay their dues for that same period or prior periods for which they were in arrears.

Intracoastal 1058 also held their Officer Elections and managed to field a full slate of Officers who have now been Installed with the detachments ROI forwarded on the DoF Adjutant.

On the District level, please be advised that I am completing my activities towards holding the District wide Leadership Class, which will be held July 21st in Pompano Beach. We now have a total of 14 Marines who will be in attendance. 10 From Intracoastal 1058 and 4 from Tamarac 755. No other detachments elected to participate. Further, as per your suggestion I contacted Tom Newton, Assistant Leadership Course Instructor and he has forwarded to me all Power Point presentational materials and all Word Programs for the current DoF curriculum currently be taught by the DoF, so that the materials we will be using is the same used by the State DoF in an effort to not dispel and inaccurate information. The class day will begin with coffee, doughnuts and bagels, with class beginning sharply at 0900 being interrupted only by a short break period and lunch, which is being provided by Intracoastal 1058. Class will resume at 1300 Hrs. followed by a short break and then completing by 1500, at which time 1058 is putting

on a Bar-B-Que for any Marine member and their guest with-in shouting distance of our detachment.

I am also pleased to inform you that on Saturday, May 26th 2018 I had to pleasure on attending the Dedication of a multi- Service and First Responder's Veterans Shrine in Lighthouse point. This dedication was the culmination of what started out to be an Eagle Scout Project for a local Boy Scout. The project, needless to say was a huge success and the young man responsible for it was instrumental in seeing it's completion thru to the end, the total cost of which ended up being in excess of \$100,000.00. I will report further upon his award of the rank of Eagle Scout as it is my intention to present him with his Eagle Scout "Good Citizens" certificate and Letter of Commendation at some point in the near future pending receipt of information.

Further, I had the pleasure of presenting same to Eagle Scout Joshua Paul Beavers on May 30th and have two more to present on June 22nd to two young men in Boca Raton, both of which have enlisted into the United States Marine Corps. I will report further on this next quarter.
